Minutes of the proceedings of Meeting of Aislaby Parish Council Held in The Parish Hall, Aislaby on Tuesday 15 March 2016 pursuant to Summons

### Present:

Also present were: V J Pitts (Clerk), SBC Cllr J Nock & Tony Barnett (Caravan Club)

Prior to the meeting there was a presentation by Tony Barnett of the Caravan Club regarding a proposed touring site at the 5 acre field opposite Toft House Farm. Noted that just at the consultation stage and plans were tabled of proposed site configuration. It was expected to have a warden on site, adequate screening and sub-drainage scheme. There was an opportunity for guestions and answers and upon enguiry it was stated: expectation would be very little noise and light pollution to those direct neighbours; the site would be open from mid March to first week in November: there would be a 'distress' shop on site and it was hoped it would stimulate the provision of a shop in the village; there was a need for a site in the NYMNP and to be viable the site could not be smaller than 60 pitches. As the Caravan Club are on a loose pre-application discussion with NYMNPA the plans were in the first iteration.

       RESOLVED for RD to put up No Smoking signs in the ladies and gents. RD to check smoke alarms
    - RESOLVED that Clerk to advise the police of the situation regarding the
      youths, which occurs somewhere between 5.30/6pm daily, and that youths
      potentially causing a nuisance and possibility that they may put people off
      from using the facilities
